- 1. One page biography including research and teaching interests
- 2. A research portfolio including:
 - A 750 word summary of a paper
 - A 500 word individual research plan covering the next 5 years
- 3. EAWOP membership status
- 4. A recommendation letter from your PhD supervisor(s)
- 5. Output list (including presentations and papers)
